Follow-up

- 1. Start by sharing with each other about your previous week.
- 2. Did you follow through on your commitment to read Scripture daily last week? Share about your experience with the group.
- 3. Did you verbally share your experience with someone else outside of your group last week? What happened? Share the experience with your group.

Knowing God

Read Luke 18:9-14.

In this week's sermon, Sam reminded us of the *surprising* truth of God's grace—none of us can earn it; God's grace is an amazing gift in Jesus Christ. He pointed out from Genesis 21 that Ishmael is a picture of our human effort in achieving God's promises. On the other hand, Isaac is a picture of God's surprising grace to His people.

- 1. According to Luke 18:9-14, what may have been surprising to Jesus' audience when they heard this teaching? Is anything about this passage surprising to you in any way?
- 2. What insight(s) about God can we glean from this passage?

Growing in Christ-likeness

- 1. Was there ever a time when you were "confident of your own righteousness" (Luke 18:9)? What did that look like? Did you learn anything from that experience?
- 2. Discuss the different attitudes and actions of the Pharisee and Tax Collector in this passage (Luke 18:10-13). What is the BIG difference between the two men?
- 3. Take some time to think about the life and ministry of Jesus. Where and how do we see him demonstrating this *surprising* grace in his ministry?

Going to Our Neighbors and the World

- 1. According to Luke 18:14, which man was justified ("just-as-if-I-had never sinned") before God? According to this verse, what is characteristic of a justified believer in Jesus Christ?
- 2. Action Step #1: If God's grace is *surprising*, where in your own life do you need to receive and apply this amazing gift from God? What would it look like to take a step in this direction?
- 3. Action Step #2: As a Christ-follower and "an ambassador of grace," who in your context do you need to demonstrate this *surprising* grace to this week? Share with the group who you will attempt to show grace toward this week.
 - Maybe it is a co-worker that you have looked down upon; perhaps it is an "annoying" neighbor—Who have you "looked down on" that you need to show grace toward?

Close in prayer together—ask God to *surprise* you with His grace this week.
